Update: AB 760 (Gordon) Community Schools Bill Held in Suspense in Assembly Appropriations Committee

With likelihood of passage diminished, partners are assessing next steps

Having passed through the Assembly Education Committee in April, **Assembly Bill 760 (Gordon) Healthy Start Community Schools** has since languished in the suspense file of the Appropriations Committee.

With the passing of time on suspense it now appears unlikely that the bill will make it to the full Assembly for consideration. We'll keep you updated here on **CCSAN** of any further **AB 760** developments. In the meantime, Partnership for Children and Youth is assessing next steps to move forward the most important proposed components of AB 760.

It showcases six (former) California Healthy Start grant recipients that have successfully built robust partnerships among the school district, local government and community-based agencies.

Letters of Support Needed for SCR 18 (Liu) Public Schools: Pupil, Teacher and Parent Surveys

Please fax letters to the Assembly Education Committee by end of day, Wed. June 29

Federal funding for Title IV Safe and Drug-Free Schools and Communities has been cut and school districts are no longer receiving funding needed to administer the **California School Climate, Health, and Learning Survey System (Cal-SCHLS)** previously required to be in compliance with No Child Left Behind.

Senate Concurrent Resolution 18 (Liu) acknowledges the importance of the data these surveys provide on resiliency, health, school culture and climate. It calls upon the state to

ensure that the California School Climate, Health, and Learning Survey System remains viable and further urges the state to pursue federal funding, grants, or other sources to ensure that school districts receive the necessary funding to support these surveys.

Cal-SCHLS is comprised of three separate surveys, the California Healthy Kids Survey (CHKS), the California School Climate Survey (CSCS), and the California School Parent Survey (CSPS). These surveys are designed to provide local education agencies and communities with data on school safety and climate, student engagement, and non-academic learning barriers such as substance abuse, bullying, health issues and violence.
